Drinking water

The drinking water projects and sanitation works would be completed at a cost of Rs 97.33 lakh. by the NGO within three months.

As part of the project, the Any Time Water (ATW) through RO plant and self-cleaning e-toilet would be set up at the RTC bus station complex. The commuters can collect one litre water by inserting Re 1 coin into the machine. The RO plant would be established in Papannapalli village of Bejjanki mandal.

A borewell and toilet complex has been planned at a

school in NTR colony in Koheda mandal. The Chola also chose Bejjanki cross roads, Gugilla and Vinjapalli villages for sanitation and ensure that every single household would have access to toilets.

Speaking on the occasion, Appreciating their sanitation measures as part of CSR programme, Mr. Vinod Kumar said that he would take the matter to the notice of Chief Minister K Chandrasekhar Rao to extend the same in entire Telangana State.
